About Jamie's Farm

Jamie's Farm is a growing national charity dedicated to transforming the lives of vulnerable young people at risk of social and academic exclusion. We work in partnership with schools and organisations to provide a 5-day residential visit that is an intensive immersion in rural life. Our impactful intervention of Farming, Family, Therapy and Legacy includes tailored activities that foster personal growth and achievement, within a supportive, family environment.

About Jamie's Farm Monmouth

Nestled above the stunning Wye Valley and the Forest of Dean is Jamie's Farm Monmouth. The farm is run on a small scale in a sustainable way that enhances the ecology of the Wye Valley and the Forest of Dean next door, surrounded by amazing wildlife and nature.

The Garden

Our garden aims to provide large proportions of food for the Monmouth kitchen. During their week on the farm, young people can engage in the full food cycle, from planting seeds to serving up meals. This hands-on experience fosters a sense of achievement and connection to nature.

Position Summary

The Garden Specialist will play a pivotal role in delivering a residential visit at Jamie's Farm Monmouth, working part-time (24 hours per week). This position offers an exciting opportunity for someone with horticultural expertise and excellent interpersonal skills to positively impact young people's lives.





Major responsibilities

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Plan and deliver engaging gardening activities with a real interest in understanding the needs of the young people whilst ensuring they feel a sense of achievement in the tasks they complete
- Develop and maintain the garden to create a purposeful, productive and beautiful environment following our wild-life friendly, sustainable, organic principles as much as possible
- Support up to four visits monthly, including leading gardening activities, participating
 in group meetings and occasionally leading/participating in a daily walk and evening
 session
- Create a detailed development plan for the garden to maximise its potential throughout the year
- Liaise with the Food Specialist to ensure that as much of our home-grown produce is used in our meals as possible
- Coordinate garden operations, including budget management, sustainability initiatives, and safety compliance following our risk assessments, and creating new ones when necessary

- Gardening experience, with a passion for sharing knowledge with young people (Essential)
- Experience working with diverse groups of young people and/or vulnerable adults (Desirable)
- Qualifications related to gardening and/or working with young people (**Desirable**)
